2. Experience Criteria: In respect of the filter applied for experience criteria, the Bidder or its OEM of the product offered in the bid {themselves or through reseller(s)} should have regularly, manufactured and supplied same or similar Category Products to any Central / State Govt Organization / PSU for number of Financial years as indicated above in the bid document before the bid opening date. Copies of relevant contracts and delivery acceptance certificates like CRAC to be submitted along with bid in support of having supplied some quantity during each of the Financial year. In case of bunch bids, the category of primary product having highest value should meet this criterion.
3. OEM Turn Over Criteria: The minimum average annual financial turnover of the OEM of the offered product during the last three years, ending on 31st March of the previous financial year, should be as indicated in the bid document. Documentary evidence in the form of certified Audited Balance Sheets of relevant periods or a certificate from the Chartered Accountant / Cost Accountant indicating the turnover details for the relevant period shall be uploaded with the bid. In case the date of constitution / incorporation of the OEM is less than 3 year old, the average turnover in respect of the completed financial years after the date of constitution shall be taken into account for this criteria.
4. Preference to Make In India products (For bids < 200 Crore):Preference shall be given to Class 1 local supplier as defined in public procurement (Preference to Make in India), Order 2017 as amended from time to time and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Nodal Ministry for specific Goods/Products. The minimum local content to qualify as a Class 1 local supplier is denoted in the bid document. If the bidder wants to avail the Purchase preference, the bidder must upload a certificate from the OEM regarding the percentage of the local content and the details of locations at which the local value addition is made along with their bid, failing which no purchase preference shall be granted. 5. Purchase preference will be given to MSEs having valid Udyam Registration and whose credentials are validated online through Udyam Registration portal as defined in Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) Order, 2012 dated 23.03.2012 issued by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and its subsequent Orders/Notifications issued by concerned Ministry. If the bidder wants to avail themselves of the Purchase preference, the bidder must be the manufacturer / OEM of the offered product on GeM. Traders are excluded from the purview of Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises and hence resellers offering products manufactured by some other OEM are not eligible for any purchase preference. In respect of bid for Services, the bidder must be the Service provider of the offered Service. Relevant documentary evidence in this regard shall be uploaded along with the bid in respect of the offered product or service and Buyer will decide eligibility for purchase preference based on documentary evidence submitted, while evaluating the bid. If L-1 is not an MSE and MSE Seller (s) has / have quoted price within L-1+ 15% (Selected by Buyer) of margin of purchase preference /price band defined in relevant policy, such MSE Seller shall be given opportunity to match L-1 price and contract will be awarded for 25% (selected by Buyer) percentage of total quantity. The buyers are advised to refer the OM No. F.1/4/2021-PPD dated 18.05.2023 [OM No.1 4 2021 PPD dated 18.05.2023](#) for compliance of Concurrent application of Public Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises Order, 2012 and Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order, 2017. Benefits of MSE will be allowed only if seller is validated on-line in GeM profile as well as validated and approved by Buyer after evaluation of documents submitted.

6. Estimated Bid Value indicated above is being declared solely for the purpose of guidance on EMD amount and for determining the Eligibility Criteria related to Turn Over, Past Performance and Project / Past Experience etc. This has no relevance or bearing on the price to be quoted by the bidders and is also not going to have any impact on bid participation. Also this is not going to be used as a criteria in determining reasonableness of quoted prices which would be determined by the buyer based on its own assessment of reasonableness and based on competitive prices received in Bid / RA process.

7. Past Performance: The Bidder or its OEM {themselves or through re-seller(s)} should have supplied same or similar Category Products for 50% of bid quantity, in at least one of the last three Financial years before the bid opening date to any Central / State Govt Organization / PSU. Copies of relevant contracts (proving supply of cumulative order quantity in any one financial year) to be submitted along with bid in support of quantity supplied in the relevant Financial year. In case of bunch bids, the category related to primary product having highest bid value should meet this criterion.

8. Reverse Auction would be conducted amongst first 50% of the technically qualified bidders arranged in the order of prices from lowest to highest. Number of sellers eligible for participating in RA would be rounded off to next higher integer value if number of technically qualified bidders is odd (e.g. if 7 bids are technically qualified, then RA will be conducted amongst L-1 to L-4). In case number of technically qualified bidders are 2 or 3, RA will be between all without any elimination. If Buyer has chosen to split the bid amongst N sellers, then minimum N sellers would be taken to RA round. In case Primary products of only one OEM are left in contention for participation in RA based on lowest 50% bidders qualifying for RA, the number of sellers qualifying for RA would be increased to get at least products of one more OEM (directly participated or through its reseller) if available. Special terms and conditions-Version:3 effective from 21-10-2022 for category Multipara Monitor - Low End

1. All Provisions of Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 and Rules made there under as amended till date will always be applicable. This will include all notifications issued by *Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation(CDSCO)*, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) and Department of Pharmaceuticals (DOP), Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers time to time in this regard.
2. The sellers are registered on GeM based on self-declaration of valid Drug License, product certification, test reports etc. However, buyers must check and validate the details at their end for all applicable licenses and certifications e.g., validity and authenticity/genuineness of drug license, product certification, manufacturer certification/licenses, test reports etc.
3. The price offered by the seller shall not, in any case exceed the DPCO controlled price, if any, fixed by the Central/State Government, the Maximum Retail Price (MRP) and the selling price. The seller must reduce the prices if there is any reduction in DPCO ceiling price, if any.
4. **Comprehensive warranty:** Comprehensive warranty shall include preventive maintenance including calibration as per technical/ service /operational manual of the manufacturer, service charges and spares. During the warranty period commencing from date of the successful completion of warranty period, Service personnel shall visit each consignee site as recommended in the manufacturer's technical/ service /operational manual, at least once in six months. warranty shall not be including the consumables. Further there will be 98% uptime warranty during warranty period on 24 (hrs) X 7 (days) X 365 (days) basis, with penalty, to extend warranty period by double the downtime period.
5. **Service centres:** Details of Service outlets in India to render services for equipment to be furnished to buyer/consignees with complete address,telephone numbers, e mails etc at time of making the supplies. It shall be the responsibility of seller to ensure that authorized service centres are available to cater to the areas where supplies are made within reasonable distance from where the service calls can be handled.Details of toll-free numbers for service call and online registration of service requests also to be provided buyer/consignee at the time of supplies.
6. **Source of supply:** It shall be responsibility of seller to provide Documents regarding source of equipments such as copy of Performa invoice or any other documents to establish that the products supplied are manufactured by OEM indicated and sourced from them.
7. **Packing and Marking:** Medical equipments being very delicate and sensitive packing for the goods should be strong and durable enough to withstand transit including transshipment (if any), rough handling, open storage etc. without any damage, deterioration etc. .The size, weights and volumes of the packing cases, remoteness of the final destination of the goods, availability or otherwise of transport and handling facilities at all points during transit up to final destination,. Quality of packing, the manner of marking within & outside the packages and provision of accompanying documentation shall take into consideration the type of medical equipments being supplied. The accessories shall be suitably labelled and packed. Each of the package shall be marked on three sides with indelible paint of proper quality: indicating contract number and date, brief description of goods including quantity, Packing list reference number, country of origin of goods and any other relevant details.
8. **Spare Parts:** Seller shall provide materials, information etc. pertaining to spare parts manufactured and supplied by the OEM. It shall be ensured that the required spares are available for purchase at least for 10 years from date of supplies. In case due to any reasons the production of the spare parts is discontinued sufficient advance notice should be given to the buyer/consignee before such discontinuation to provide adequate time to purchase the required spare parts etc. Further, OEM and their service centres/dealers shall carry sufficient inventories to assure ex-stock supply of consumables and spares for the equipments so that the same are available.
OEM or reseller shall always accord most favoured client status

to the buyer/consignee and shall give the most competitive price for spares and consumables of its machines/equipments supplied.

9. **Installation, Training, Manuals:** Seller shall be responsible to carry out Installation & commissioning, Supervision and Demonstration of the goods. They shall provide required jigs and tools for assembly, minor civil works for the completion of the installation and Training of Consignee's representatives for operating and maintaining the equipment and supplying required number of operation & maintenance manual for the goods. In case the category parameters are specifying any requirements regarding the installations, training and manuals the same shall also be applicable.
10. **Electrical safety checking:** Sellers are required to make sure that they furnish the list of equipments for carrying out routine and preventive maintenance to buyer/consignee. They should make sure to periodically check the electrical safety aspects as per BIS Safety Standards or equivalent. In case they do not have required equipment for such testing should ensure that the equipments checked for electrical safety compliance through labs with facilities for such checking during every preventive maintenance call.
11. **Software:** All software updates should be provided free of cost during warranty period.
12. Any other Terms and Conditions which is not included or at variance with the conditions specified in STC/GTC, may be added by the buyer through Additional Terms and Conditions in the bid to ensure items are procured from authentic/validated source with appropriate and applicable quality. The above terms and conditions are in reverse order of precedence i.e. ATC shall supersede specific STC which shall supersede General Terms and Conditions ("GTC"), whenever there are any conflicting provisions.

OPTION CLAUSE: The Purchaser reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 25 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. The purchaser also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity up to 25% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at the contracted rates. The delivery period of quantity shall commence from the last date of original delivery order and in cases where option clause is exercised during the extended delivery period the additional time shall commence from the last date of extended delivery period. The additional delivery time shall be $(\text{Increased quantity} \div \text{Original quantity}) \times \text{Original delivery period (in days)}$, subject to minimum of 30 days. If the original delivery period is less than 30 days, the additional time equals the original delivery period. The Purchaser may extend this calculated delivery duration up to the original delivery period while exercising the option clause. Bidders must comply with these terms.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Bidder shall not sublet, transfer, assign the contract or any part thereof.
2. Bidder is entirely responsible for the execution of supply order in all respect (supply, installation, testing & commissioning) in accordance with the terms & conditions as specified in the tender.
3. If the Bidder fails in fulfilling terms & conditions of the tender, it is treated as breach of contract and the Medical Superintendent shall be entitled to make other arrangement at the risk and expense of the Bidder.
4. Bidder shall quote only those products in the bid which are not obsolete in the market and has at least 10 years residual market life i.e. the offered product shall not be declared end of life by the OEM before this period.
5. Bidder should ensure the equipment to be provided should be brand new and good quality in line with the specification mentioned in the terms and conditions of the bid. Any equipment with poor quality/refurbished shall be summarily rejected and the Bidder has to bear the transport charges of rejected items.
6. Bidder should provide software up gradation (wherever applicable) at free of cost.
7. Bidder should provide regular/periodical maintenance of equipment i.e. minimum four visits per annum during warranty period and any number of breakdown calls.
8. **For Warranty:** No separate charges will be paid for regular/periodical maintenance, any breakdown

n call service rendered during warranty period.

9. **For CMC:** Bidder should provide regular/periodical maintenance of equipment i.e.minimum four visits per annum during CMC period and any number of breakdown calls. Charges will be paid on quarterly/half-yearly basis as per the quoted price.
10. Service centre should be available in Tamilnadu or Kerala.
11. Bidder should attend breakdown call if any in-person within 24 hours of registration of such call during the warranty and comprehensive maintenance contract period.
12. Bidder should provide complete details of service centre including contact number, email address and name of the service personal.
13. Bidder should ensure the repair/maintenance of equipment including replacement of equipment/spares/accessories (in case of unrepairable) at free of cost during the warranty and comprehensive maintenance contract period.
14. Physical live demonstration of equipment is mandatory. Bidder should demonstrate the equipment at ESIC Hospital Tiruppur by their own cost. The bidder should submit an undertaking in this regard as per **proforma-A**. Bids received without undertaking for live demonstration of equipment will be summarily rejected. **No Virtual Demo will be entertained.**
15. Bidder should submit undertaking certificate as per **Proforma-B** along with bid.
16. Bidder should submit Integrity pact as per **Proforma-C** along with bid.
17. Offered product should comply with standards/certifications such as BIS/CDSCO/ ISO etc.
18. Bidders should submit compliance certificate as per GFR-144(xi).
19. **EMD:** Rs.2,25,000/- to be paid in the form of Account payee Demand Draft only in favour of ESIC Fund Account No.1 payable at Tiruppur.

Performance Security

20. The successful bidder should submit 5% of bid Value of equipment as performance security in the form of Account payee Demand Draft only in favour of ESIC Fund Account No.1 payable at Tiruppur. After award of contract, successful bidder to upload scanned copy of demand draft in place of PBG and has to ensure delivery of hard copy of original demand draft to buyer within 15 days of award of contract.
21. The successful bidder should submit 5% of total CMC charges as performance security for Comprehensive Maintenance Contract in the form of Account payee Demand Draft only in favour of ESIC Fund Account No.1 payable at Tiruppur before commencement of CMC.
22. Performance security for equipment will be refunded without any interest after completion of warranty period plus two months, once all the contractual obligations (including satisfactory performance report from user department) are fulfilled and receipt of performance security for the Comprehensive Maintenance Contract.
23. Warranty period shall be commenced from the date of final acceptance certificate (FAC) of equipment.
24. Performance security for CMC will be refunded without any interest after completion of CMC period plus two months, once all the contractual obligations are fulfilled (including satisfactory performance report from user department).
25. On unsatisfactory performance or violation of terms and conditions of the contract, will make the contractor liable for forfeiture of Performance security. The decision of competent authority will be final in this count.

Payment Terms:

26. **Payment for Equipment:** Payment shall be made through (RTGS/NEFT) within 30 days from the date of final acceptance of equipment which include supply, inspection, installation & commissioning and observation period.
27. **Payment of CMC** will be made on quarterly/half-yearly basis after satisfactory completion of said period, duly certified by the end user.
28. The successful bidder should sign a memorandum of understanding with ESIC Tiruppur Hospital for supply, inspection, installation & commissioning and Warranty of equipment.

Force majeure clause.

- a. The work under the contract shall continue, during the Arbitration proceedings.
- b. The award of the Arbitrator shall be final, conclusive and binding on both the parties

PRE-CONTRACT INTEGRITY PACT

General

1. This prebid-contract Agreement (hereinafter called the Integrity Pact) is made on..... the day of the month of year.....Between on one hand of Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) under the administrative control of Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India acting through (hereinafter called the "BUYER" which expression shall mean and include, unless the context otherwise requires his successors in office and assigns) of the First Party and M/s _____, represented by -----, Chief Executive Officer (hereinafter called the "BIDDER/SELLER"

which expression shall mean and include, unless the context otherwise requires his successors in office and assigns) of the Second Party. WHERE as the BUYER proposes to procure services (Name of Items to be procured) and the Bidder/Seller is willing to offer/has offered the stores/services.

2. Whereas the Bidder is a private company/ public company/ partnership/ proprietorship constituted in accordance with the relevant law in the matter and the Buyer is a -----performing its functions on behalf of _____ of India.

Objectives

Now, therefore, the Buyer and the Bidder agree to enter into this pre-contract agreement, hereinafter referred to as Integrity Pact, to avoid all forms of corruption by following a system that is fair, transparent and free from any influence/unprejudiced dealings prior to, during and subsequent to the currency of the contract to be entered into with a view to:-

- 2.1 . Enabling the Buyer to obtain the desired said stores at a competitive price in conformity with the defined specifications of the Services by avoiding the high cost and the distortionary impact of corruption on public procurement, and
- 2.2 . Enabling bidders to abstain from bribing or any corrupt practice in order to secure the contract by providing assurance to them that their competitors will also refrain from bribing and other corrupt practices and the Buyer will commit to prevent corruption, in any form, by their officials by following transparent procedures.

Commitments of Buyer

3. The Buyer Commits itself to the following: -

- 3.1 The Buyer undertakes that no official of the Buyer, connected directly or indirectly with the contract, will demand, take a promise for or accept, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the Bidder, either for themselves or for any person, organization or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to the Contract.
- 3.2 The Buyer will, during the pre-contract stage, treat all Bidders alike, and will provide to all Bidders the same information and will not provide any such information to any particular Bidder which could afford an advantage to that particular Bidder in comparison to other Bidders.
- 3.3 All the officials of the Buyer will report to the appropriate Government office any attempted or completed breaches of the above commitments as well as any substantial suspicion of such a breach.
4. In case of any such preceding misconduct on the part of such official(s) is reported by the Bidder to the Buyer with full and verifiable facts and the same is *prima facie* found to be correct by the Buyer, necessary disciplinary proceedings, or any other action as deemed fit, including criminal proceedings may be initiated by the Buyer and such a person shall be debarred from further dealings related to the contract process. In such a case while an enquiry is being conducted by the Buyer the proceedings under the contract would not be stalled.

Commitments of Bidders

5. The Bidder commits himself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of his bid or during any pre-contract or post-contract stage in order to secure the contractor in furtherance to secure it and in particular commits himself to

he following: -

- 5.1 The Bidder will not offer, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the Buyer, connected directly or indirectly with the bidding process, or to any person, organization or third party related to the contract in exchange for any advantage in the bidding, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the Contract.
- 5.2 The Bidder further undertakes that he has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the Buyer or otherwise in procuring the Contract or forbearing to do or having done any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of the Contract or any other Contract with the Government for showing or forbearing to show favour or disfavor to any person in relation to the Contract or any other Contract with the Government.
- 5.3 The Bidder will not collude with other parties interested in the contract to impair the transparency, fairness and progress of the bidding process, bid evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- 5.4 The Bidder will not accept any advantage in exchange for any corrupt practice, unfair means and illegal activities.
- 5.5 The bidder further confirms and declares to the Buyer that the Bidder is the original manufacturer/integrator/authorized government sponsored export entity of the defense stores and has not engaged any individual or firm or company whether Indian or foreign to intercede, facilitate or in any way to recommend to the Buyer or any of its functionaries, whether officially or unofficially to the award of the contract to the Bidder, nor has any amount been paid, promised or intended to be paid to any such individual, firm or company in respect of any such intercession, facilitation or recommendation.
- 5.6 The Bidder, either while presenting the bid or during pre-contract negotiations or before signing the contract, shall disclose any payments he has made, is committed to or intends to make to officials of the Buyer or their family members, agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the contract and the details of services agreed upon for such payments.
- 5.7 The Bidder shall not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information provided by the Buyer as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained in any electronic data carrier. The Bidder also undertakes to exercise due and adequate care lest any such information is divulged.
- 5.8 The Bidder commits to refrain from giving any complaint directly or through any other manner with supporting information with full and verifiable facts.
- 5.9 The Bidder shall not instigate or cause to instigate any third person to commit any of the actions mentioned above.

6. Previous Transgression

- 6.1 The Bidder declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last three years immediately before signing of this Integrity Pact, with any other company in any country in respect of any corrupt practices envisaged here under or with any Public Sector Enterprise in India or any Government Department in India that could justify bidder's exclusion from the tender process.

- 6.2 If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, Bidder can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

7. Security Deposit

- a. The Security Deposit shall be valid till the complete conclusion of contractual obligations to complete satisfaction of both the bidder and the buyer, whichever is later.
- b. In the case of successful bidder a clause would also be incorporated in the Article pertaining to Performance Bond in the Purchase Contract that the provisions of Sanctions for Violation shall be applicable for forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the Buyer to forfeit the same with assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of this pact.
- c. The provisions regarding Sanctions for Violation in Integrity Pact include forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the Buyer to forfeit the same with assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of Integrity Pact.
- d. No interest shall be payable by the Buyer to the Bidder(s) on Security Deposit for the period of its currency.

8. Company Code of Conduct

- 8.1 Bidders are also advised to have a company code of conduct (clearly rejecting the use of bribes and other unethical behavior) and a compliance program for the implementation of the code of conduct throughout the company.

9. Sanctions for Violation

- 9.1 Any breach of the aforesaid provisions by the Bidder or any one employed by him or acting on his behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the Bidder) or the commission of any offence by the Bidder or any one employed by him or acting on his behalf, as defined in Chapter IX of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 or the Prevention of Corruption Act 1988 or any other act enacted for the prevention of corruption shall entitle the Buyer to take all or any one of the following actions, wherever required:-
- a. To immediately call off the pre-contract negotiations with assigning any reason or giving any compensation to the Bidder. However, the proceedings with the other Bidder(s) would continue.
 - b. The Security Deposit/Performance Bond shall stand forfeited either fully or partially, as decided by the Buyer and the Buyer shall not be required to assign any reason therefore.
 - c. To immediately cancel the contract, if already signed, with giving any compensation to the Bidder.
 - d. To recover all sums already paid by the Buyer, and in case of an Indian Bidder with interest thereon at 2% higher than the prevailing Prime Lending Rate, while in case of a Bidder from a country other than India with interest thereon at 2% higher than the LIBOR. If any outstanding payment is due to the Buyer from the Bidder in connection with any other contract for any other stores, such outstanding payment could also be utilized to recover the aforesaid sum and interest.
 - e. To encash the advance bank guarantee and performance bond/warranty bond, if furnished by the Bidder, in order to recover the payments, already made by the Buyer, along with interest.
 - f. To cancel all or any other Contracts with the Bidder.
 - g. To debar the Bidder from entering into any bid from the Government of India for a minimum period of five years, which may be further extended at the discretion of the Buyer.

- h. To recover all sums paid in violation of this Pact by Bidder(s) to any middleman or agent or broker with a view to securing the contract.
- i. If the Bidder or any employee of the Bidder or any person acting on behalf of the Bidder, either directly or indirectly, is closely related to any of the officers of the Buyer, or alternatively, if any close relative of an officer of the Buyer has financial interest/stake in the Bidder's firm, the same shall be disclosed by the Bidder at the time offering of tender. Any failure to disclose the interest involved shall entitle the Buyer to rescind the contract with payment of any compensation to the Bidder.
- j. The term 'close relative' for this purpose would mean spouse whether residing with the Government servant or not, but not include a spouse separated from the Government servant by a decree or order of a competent court; son or daughter or step son or step daughter and wholly dependent upon Government servant, but does not include a child or step child who is no longer in any way dependent upon the Government servant or of whose custody the Government servant has been deprived of by or under any law; any other person related, whether by blood or marriage, to the Government servant or to the Government servant's wife or husband and wholly dependent upon Government servant.
- k. The Bidder shall not lend to or borrow any money from or enter into any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any employee of the Buyer, and if he does so, the Buyer shall be entitled forthwith to rescind the contract and all other contracts with the Bidder. The Bidder shall be liable to pay compensation for any loss or damage to the Buyer resulting from such rescission and the Buyer shall be entitled to deduct the amount so payable from the money(s) due to the Bidder.

10. **Fall Clause**

The Bidder undertakes that he has not supplied/is not supplying the similar systems or subsystems at a price lower than that offered in the present bid in respect of any other Ministry/Department of the Government of India and if it is found at any stage that the similar system or sub-system was supplied by the Bidder to any other Ministry/Department of the Government of India at a lower price, then that very price will be applicable to the present case and the difference in the cost would be refunded by the Bidder to the Buyer, if the contract has already been concluded.

11. **Examination of Books of Accounts**

In case of any allegation of violation of any provisions of this Integrity Pact or payment of commission, the Buyer or its agencies shall be entitled to examine the Books of Accounts of the Bidder and the Bidder shall provide necessary information of the relevant financial documents in English and shall extend all possible help for the purpose of such examination.

12. **Law and Place of Jurisdiction**

This Pact is subject to Indian Law. The place of performance and jurisdiction is the seat of the Buyer i.e. **Tiruppur, Tamilnadu** or as decided by the BUYER.

13. **Other Legal Actions**

The actions stipulated in this Integrity Pact are with prejudice to any other legal action that may follow in accordance with the provisions of the extant law in force relating to any civil or criminal proceedings.

14. **Validity**

14.1 The validity of this Integrity Pact shall be from date of its signing and extend upto 5 years or the complete execution of the contract to the satisfaction of both the Buyer and the Bidder/Seller, whichever is later.

14.2 Should one or several provisions of this Pact turnout to be invalid; the remainder of this Pact remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.

15. Both the parties signing this integrity pact shall be abided by the provisions of this pact and will follow the guidelines of independent external monitors or any other monitoring committee nominated by the competent authority for the purpose at any stage.

8.2.The calculation of CMC Charges shall take into account the number of years of warranty and duration of CMC as specified while creating bid.

8.3.In the price evaluation, the system shall provide function to calculate the cost of each equipment by formula indicated below including CMC and then show the inter-se-ranking of the bidders. The following are the variables

(i) Number of years for which CMC required.

(ii) Number of years of product warranty

The formula for calculating total cost including CMC charges shall be as under:

Total Cost for evaluation=

$C + C * \{(A1/100)/(1.10^n) + (A2/100)/(1.10^{n+1}) + (A3/100)/(1.10^{n+2}) + (A4/100)/(1.10^{n+3}) + (A5/100)/(1.10^{n+4})\}$ and so on

C – Cost for equipment quoted and n shall be number of years of product warranty specified.

If 2 year warranty specified, n shall be 2 and if 5 year warranty specified, n shall be 5. A1, A2, A3, A4 & A5 shall depend on how many years CMC selected. For 3 year CMC, only A1, A2 and A3 factors are to be taken into account and A4 and A5 will not be applicable.

8.4. CMC charges offered for each subsequent year should be same or higher than preceding year.

8.5. The CMC charges shall be offered within range of 3 to 10% of cost of equipment.

9. Since CMC charges are to be paid only later for each year during CMC period, applicable performance guarantee amount after placement of contract shall be based on the cost of equipment excluding the cost of CMC Charges.

10. Performance bank guarantee applicable for CMC is to be submitted at start of the CMC and shall be applicable between 2.5% to 10% as specified in bid on total CMC Charges. The PBG submitted after award of contract shall be released only after new PBG for the CMC period is submitted and accepted by buyer/consignee after due verification. Bank guarantee for CMC is to remain valid till completion of CMC period plus one year. The bank guarantee for CMC shall be submitted to buyer directly. In case, seller fails to submit the PBG or does not provide services for the CMC contract after expiry of warranty period then PBG of equipment shall be forfeited.

11. In case of splitting of order quantity, equipment cost and CMC charges offered by L1 bidder shall be matched by higher quoting eligible bidders on one-to-one basis. The equipment cost and CMC charges (year to year) shall be matched individually.

12. The CMC Contract shall be an offline contract to be handled by buyer. The payment of CMC will be made on quarterly basis after satisfactory completion of said period, duly certified by end user and scope of CMC will be as per para 1 above.

13. CMC Charges are inclusive of all the charges for Transportation, Lodging, Boarding, all insurances including third party insurance and all other incidental charges. The same shall include GST. The prices also include cost of spares and damaged parts. Purchaser does not have any liability, whatsoever, over and above the cost of CMC. It also includes for arranging hand tools & tackles, special tools etc. required to carry out the work.

All GeM Sellers / Service Providers are mandated to ensure compliance with all the applicable laws / acts / rules including but not limited to all Labour Laws such as The Minimum Wages Act, 1948, The Payment of Wages Act, 1936, The Payment of Bonus Act, 1965, The Equal Remuneration Act, 1976, The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972 etc. Any non-compliance will be treated as breach of contract and Buyer may take suitable actions as per GeM Contract.

जेम की सामान्य शर्तों के खंड 26 के संदर्भ में भारत के साथ भूमि सीमा साझा करने वाले देश के बिडर से खरीद पर प्रतिबंध के संबंध में भारत के साथ भूमि सीमा साझा करने वाले देश का कोई भी बिडर इस निविदा में बिड देने के लिए तभी पात्र होगा जब वह बिड देने वाला सक्षम प्राधिकारी के पास पंजीकृत हो। बिड में भाग लेते समय बिडर को इसका अनुपालन करना होगा और कोई भी गलत घोषणा किए जाने व इसका अनुपालन न करने पर अनुबंध को तत्काल समाप्त करने और कानून के अनुसार आगे की कानूनी कार्यवाई का आधार होगा।

In terms of GeM GTC clause 26 regarding Restrictions on procurement from a bidder of a country which shares a land border with India, any bidder from a country which shares a land border with India will be eligible to bid in this tender only if the bidder is registered with the Competent Authority. While participating in bid, Bidder has to undertake compliance of this and any false declaration and non-compliance of this would be a ground for immediate termination of the contract and further legal action in accordance with the laws.
